Welcome!Annual Reports Package - the important info . . .

Everyone on our church mailing list is receiving this packet of reports, members and non-members alike. Since all of us are invested in this congregation, we feel that this information is important to all who worship with us.

The distinction is that only confirmed members of record of the congregation may vote or hold an office. If you are uncertain whether or not you are a confirmed member, please ask Pastor Bob, or Pastor John.

Questions from anyone, member or non-member, pertaining to both the budget, and/or reports are due in writing (by post or e-mail) to the church office no later than February 11, 2018. Answers will be available in writing at the meetings. In order to be fair to the people at all three meetings, there will be no questions from the floor at the February 18 meeting.

Nominations for Church Council and Synod Assembly Delegates are due in writing by February 11, 2018. Again, in order to be fair to the people at all three meetings, there can be no nominations from the floor of the meetings. A vote will be held on February 18 for all council nominees and Synod Assembly delegates.

There will be three meetings - one after each service on Sunday, February 18. Despite having Lent Wednesday worship that week, there will be no Wednesday meeting date. Holding three meetings on February 18 is to assure that we have a quorum of confirmed members present to vote. In years past, we have tried various other options for meetings, but these did not produce the quorum needed to hold a valid meeting. Our constitution mandates that a quorum is 10% of the confirmed members of the congregation. As it stands now, that would be 35 confirmed members.

This system of Annual Meetings was approved by the Church Council and approved by the Congregation a few years ago and is now a part of our Church Constitution, which has been approved by both the Metro NY Synod and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Five years ago, proxy votes were allowed for our homebound members to be included in the process.

PreSchool Report - Our 21st Graduating Class!

Happy and healthy New Year to everyone!

The school started in January with the registration of a new batch of kids. We were initially fully enrolled by the end of the registration period with an extensive waitlist. The waitlist however did not last long as the Department of Education has pushed forward on an initiative to have every 4 year old in New York placed in a prekindergarten class.

Our waitlist dwindled to only a handful of names by the time the 2017 school year started. Much like previous years, we lost several students by September/October as many move away or change their minds. We greatly struggled to find the remaining students by the enrollment deadline but miraculously we were able to fully enroll in the eleventh hour when a grandmother rang the doorbell looking for placement literally minutes before we were about to miss the mark.

The teachers were given the opportunity to earn free educational materials by attending professional development workshops throughout the year. In total the school was given thousands and thousands of dollars worth of educational supplies and the teachers walked away with new teaching methods and strategies.

We were overwhelmed with pride as we sent off our 2016/2017 graduates off to kindergarten in June. Since September, our new batch of children have been gaining new experiences and knowledge about their lives here at school, home and around the neighborhood. It's always very fulfilling to watch the children flourish! We're very fortunate to have the opportunity to work with the children in the community to build an educational foundation that will hopefully stay with them for the rest of their lives.

In the busy months before all the different events and holidays that take place at Our Saviour Lutheran Church - Second Saturday has become a savior to us. Many hands make the work go quicker! We would also like to thank Pastors Robert Fritch "Bob" and John Heidgerd and to the volunteers from our church for their dedicated support. This was a very informative session. We are looking forward to next year's event

to bring new areas of information on wellness to our congregation and community. This year, 2018, we will be hosting the team on "Special Services to our Community – people with special needs".

In conjunction with the Wellness Event, we delivered sixteen (16) healthy dinners to sixteen (16) residents at an Assisted Living Center.

We continue to pray for God's guidance to help us to recognize opportunities to serve others and the less fortunate in our midst. This year we reached out to the Women's Shelter for battered women. Membership Statistical Adjustment

A long oversdue project was the correcting of our membership numbers, or rolls. According to our Church Constitution, if a member of the church has not worshipped, or given to the church, at least once during a given calendar year, they cease to be a member. Since we have no way of tracking worship attendance, the only barometer we have is giving records. It has been many years since we undertook this project, so the numbers are staggering.

A letter was mailed to members, or member families who have not given to the church in the past two years, along with a postage paid return card on which they could check a box whther, or not, they wished to remain a member. Many churches simply send out a letter that simply says, "you are no longer a member" - but, we felt this was a bit friendlier.

The results of this adjustment, or purging of the rolls is as follows

Removed from the membership rolls - 132 baptized members & 220 Confirmed Members

Current Baptized membership - 593

Current Confirmed Membership - 373

If you do have any, please submit them in writing to the church office by February 11, 2018. The answers will then be published for presentation to the congregation on the day of the meeting.

A legacy gift to the congregation from Roy and Alma Mayer

On December 21, Our Saviour received title to the house once owned by Alma and Roy Mayer, both now deceased, in Jamaica Hills. Pastor Bob had been working with Alma for years to make this dream a reality - a dream for both the church and for Alma. Alma and Roy wanted to thank the church for all the meaningful years they had here throughout their lifetimes. Alma especially wanted to recognize the turnaround of the church in the past twenty years, something that made her very proud.

No decisions have been made as to what will happen next with this extravagant gift to the church. For now, we have transferred all the utilities into the church name and will soon begin cleaning out the house and the contents that were left by the heirs to the estate.

Church Council has commissioned a professional feasibility study that will look at all three of the church's properties (church, parsonage, Alma's house) and look at appraisal values, housing trends, and the many possibilities this gift affords us.

A select group of leaders will meet the end of January with a consultant, and our attorney, to explore and dream a little what the future might look like for us with a gift of this size.

While we know that not everyone is able to bequeath their house to the church, this is perhaps, a good time to think about how you might give a legacy gift to the church to give thanks for the ministry in this place. There are many ways to do that - ways that you might never have thought of - but, ways that will allow the ministry here to continue to flourish for years and years to come.


